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# THE EIGHT-DAY PROJECT PLAN

DAY	ACTION STEPS	Write down notes/questions you may have:
<b>DAY 1:</b> Prep Day	<p>Look at your SOAP (on the front side of this paper) and write the due date for your project and count back 9 days. <b>That day is your Day 1.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read over project details and directions carefully twice</li> <li>• What is the required format?- ex: MLA, APA, PowerPoint, Creative Project, etc.</li> <li>• Highlight the steps you need to complete</li> <li>• Break your project into manageable tasks- <b>Use the SOAP to write down your daily action steps</b></li> </ul>	
<b>DAY 2:</b> Planning Day	<p>Draft an outline of your project:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Introduction</li> <li>• Argument/ literature on your topic</li> <li>• The “so what” factor- why is this important?</li> <li>• Look at lecture slides and course reading materials to build your project</li> </ul>	
<b>DAY 3:</b> Research Day	<p>Use the U of A library website to find scholarly articles to support your project.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What you want to know about your topic</li> <li>• Collect quotes and citations to write in later. Keep a running reference page</li> <li>• Don’t be afraid to ask for help from Library staff</li> </ul>	
<b>DAY 4:</b> Rest Day	<p>Catch up on other homework. <b>You’re making great progress!</b></p>	
<b>DAY 5:</b> Writing Day	<p>Take your draft to the <a href="#">Writing Center</a> for feedback and ask them to check for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clarity of concepts</li> <li>• Does your evidence support your argument?</li> </ul>	
<b>DAY 6:</b> Edit Day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make corrections</li> <li>• Add more evidence to your “so what”</li> </ul>	
<b>DAY 7:</b> Reference Day	<p>Edit and alphabetize your references. Make sure your references are in the correct format (MLA, APA)</p>	
<b>DAY 8:</b> Final Edit Day	<p>Visit the Writing Center and ask for final edits and feedback. Read through and make final edits.</p>	
<b>DUE DATE:</b> Turn it in!	<p>One final read though! Submit your project with confidence!</p>
